GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS



GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Complete a total of 26 credits, including credits required by the State Board of Education.
- 2. Pass examinations on the provisions and principles of American history, American institutions, American civics, and the Missouri and U.S. Constitutions. (" 170.011, .345, RSMo.)
- 3. Successfully complete a course of instruction of at least one semester in length on the institutions, branches and functions of the government of the state of Missouri, including local governments, the U.S. government and the electoral process. (' 170.011, RSMo.)
- 4. Have earned credit in the Nodaway-Holt R-VII School District's educational program between the ninth and twelfth grades.
- 5. Have taken all required end-of-course (EOC) examinations. (DESE Graduation Guidance)
- 6. Have received 30 minutes of cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) instruction and training in the proper performance of the Heimlich maneuver or other first aid for choking. (' 170.310, RSMo.)
- 7. All seniors must be in attendance 80% of the time their senior year.

DUAL CREDIT/DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES

Something to consider:

- \$95/credit hour (MWSU) or \$107/credit hour (NWMSU) in high school vs.
 \$300/credit hour while in college
- Can help to complete general requirements at both high school and college level concurrently
- No limit to the number of courses a students can enroll in
- Many courses are widely transferable in state
 - Nationally accredited = easier out-of-state transferability
- All access to campus, including library, facilities, laptops, events, etc.
- Introduction to and exploration of potential career pathways

APPLICATION DOCUMENT REQUIREMENTS

- Students will need to complete the **Vocational-Technical School Agreement** (including parent signatures)
- Students will need to complete the Northwest Technical School Application
- In addition, students will also need to submit a **typed summary** with the following information
 - 1. What program you are wishing to participate in at Vo-Tech.
 - 2. What knowledge you hope to gain from Vo-Tech.
 - 3. How you will utilize the information learned at Vo-Tech for your future career goals.

Students also need to include **one letter of recommendation** from a person that is not listed above (letter of recommendation is addressed to the Selection Committee not to Vo-Tech).

All required information must be submitted by **May 1st** in order to be considered to attend Vo-Tech for the next school year.

NTS INTERNSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- Qualifying students must:
 - a. Have senior status at Nodaway-Holt R-VII School District.
 - b. Be in the last quarter of their final year in their program of study at the Northwest Technical School.
 - c. Maintain a minimum attendance rate of 92% during the entire school year.
 - d. Be considered a "creditable citizen." Those students whose character or conduct is such as to reflect discredit upon themselves or their school is not considered a creditable citizen. Conduct shall be satisfactory in accord with the standards of good discipline.
 - e. Present a typed letter, requesting permission to be placed in an internship with an approved business **in their respective field of study**.
 - f. Turn in all completed application paperwork for the internship program.
 - g. Obtain a letter of recommendation by their instructor at the Northwest Technical School.
 - h. Maintain a "B" average in all vocational technical classes for the duration of their program.

IDENTIFYING INTERESTS

For an ICAP to mean anything, students must be exploring interests.

 - MOSAIC's AHEC program is excellent for those interested in Health Science
- College Visits

 - 12th Grade allowed 2 excused absences



ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY



ATTENDANCE RULES

A student must be in attendance the **entire day (8:00-3:40)** in order to attend or participate in a school activity that same day. This means, if a student is tardy to first hour they are ineligible to participate in any extracurricular that day. **Certain instances will be excusable at the discretion of the principal (advanced approval required for appointments), or a doctor's note is presented.** All excused absences will be addressed individually by coaches, and could require training/conditioning for time missed. This could also lead to a reduction in playing time as stated by individual team rules.

If an event is scheduled for a Saturday, students must be in attendance the entire day (8:00-3:40) on the preceding school day, or be excused by the principal, to participate.

If a participant has more than 3 unexcused (an absence that is not pre-arranged with the head coach) absences from practice or an activity, they will be removed from the activity.

Students must be in attendance for at least half of the school day to be able to attend practice.



ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY

Grade checks will be conducted on the first school day of every week, starting with the third week of each quarter. Any student, grades 7-12, with an F letter grade after each grade check will be ineligible to participate in any extracurricular until the next grade check. This includes, but is not limited to, athletics, cheerleading, FBLA, FCCLA, FFA, field trips, prom, trap shooting, etc. This does not, however, include activities that are required for a grade in class; i.e. marching band, concert band, choir performances, etc.







A+

Students must have:

- 95% attendance
- A GPA of 2.5 or above
- Proficient or Advanced on the Algebra I EOC
- 50 hours of unpaid tutoring/mentoring
- A signed agreement with Mrs. Ginther (see the A+ Student Handbook on the school website)
- A record of good citizenship and no drug/alcohol/tobacco related offenses
- Completed FAFSA

Following graduation, an official copy of the student's transcript with A+ certification will be submitted to their postsecondary institution. The institution will distribute A+.



ADDITIONAL HELPFUL TIPS



TIPS FOR PARENTS

- Engage in conversation about your student's school day don't stop at "how was your day?"
- Make sure your child has time set aside to complete homework.
- Keep communication lines open between yourself and your student's teachers.
- Contact your child's teacher first if you have any concerns. The teacher will consult with the principal if needed.
- Value your child's education and express the importance of it every single day.
